The picturesque town of Eden is set on a deep natural harbour and is surrounded by National Park.

The cruising operations of Eden are supported by the local volunteer organisation **Cruise Eden**, the **Port Authority of New South Wales** and **Bega Valley Shire Council**.

When you disembark in Snug Cove, make sure you explore the **Cruise Markets** as well as the award-winning **Eden Welcome Centre**. Inside you will find the Eden Visitor Information Centre where you can purchase local products and souvenirs.

A regular **shuttle bus** runs on cruise days, from Snug Cove to the town centre – shuttle buses leave from the Eden Welcome Centre.
